The school relies on parents paying the optional items in order to run a high quality, robust learning program. As a school we include all incursion/excursion and additional costs through the parent payment schedule to avoid unseen costs to families. Parents who choose not to contribute, or who are unable to pay the optional fees, will be charged only the excursion/incursion/specialist programs component for each subject. These are clearly indicated in bold, next to each subject. We will also charge \$50 for the provision of a student card, printing credit and Compass modules related to student learning.
