Socks must be worn over the ankle and have no brand marks/logos.

Year 12	Dress Code	All Year	<p>Sandringham College Senior Campus is a young adult learning environment. Students enrolled full-time in Year 12 are expected to dress appropriately within the guidelines set by the Sandringham College Dress Code and Uniform Policy. The attire should reflect the values of the college, be respectful and include an awareness of what is appropriate for the school as a workplace. Year 12 students acknowledge their responsibility to contribute to the positive appearance of the College.</p> <p>Appropriate dress includes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jeans, shorts and skirts to mid-thigh • T-shirts, casual business shirts • Sandals or shoes <p>Inappropriate dress includes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ripped jeans or trousers, short shorts, skirts above mid-thigh • Midriff tops, tank tops, clothing with offensive slogans or graphics • Thongs and UGG boots • Active wear such as leggings or tight fitting lycra worn as the outer garment (only permitted during Dance/PE/Sport classes) • See through materials and clothing • Pyjamas, sleepwear and slippers <p>Year 12 students acknowledge the College Principal’s authority to make final decisions regarding the appropriateness of a students’ clothing.</p>
Special Occasion		Specific Period	<p>Special Occasion school wear – for certain school events commemorative items of clothing are designed e.g. School Production T-shirt/Music Tour. These specific clothing items may be worn at school for a period of two weeks only. Students will be advised of the time period during which these items may be worn at school.</p>

Years 7-12	Jewellery, Hair, Make-up, Nails, Piercings	All year	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The only jewellery permitted to be worn outside the uniform is a wristwatch and no more than two pairs of small studs or sleepers, worn in the earlobes. For OHS reasons, earrings must be no longer than 3cm in length. Necklaces or pendants must not be visible • Single nose piercing – small, clear stud is permitted for students in Year 10, 11 and 12 • NO other facial piercings. This includes lip, eyebrow, or chin piercings. • No noticeable make-up is to be worn. • Hairstyles should be neat and tidy. Only natural hair colours are permitted. No extreme hairstyles (e.g. mohawks, undercuts, shaved sides) are permitted. • Facial hair should be kept neat and tidy. • Hair ribbons and accessories should be navy, white or a neutral colour which matches the hair (e.g. a brown clasp). • Only clear or natural skin coloured nail polish may be worn. Students who apply shellac or other long-lasting nail colour during the holidays should make arrangements for its removal before the school term starts. • Heavy false eyelashes are not permitted
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Complete and correct Sandringham College uniform must be worn at all times during the school day. This includes

- Travelling to and from school
- In class and in the yard
- On excursions, unless other specified
- When representing the school at official functions

Summer Uniform should be worn during Terms 1 and 4. Winter uniform should be worn during Terms 2 and 3. Crossover times when either summer or winter uniform may be worn are Term 2 (first two weeks) and Term 4 (first two weeks)

Sports Uniform may only be worn to and/or from school if a student is involved in

- a Sports Event or
- a Physical education class in Period 1 and 2 or Period 5 and 6.

Students must not wear their sports uniform for the whole day.

Second Hand Uniform Shop

Sandringham College PTF runs a second hand uniform shop. The second hand uniform shop is open every Thursday morning 8.15am to 9.15am at the Bluff Road Campus. If you would like to donate your uniforms, collection bins are located at Bluff Road Reception and Holloway Road Student Managers office. All funds raised go towards the many PTF projects directly supporting our students and school community.

Out of Uniform

- Students wearing non-uniform items will be asked to remove said items as practicable. The school discipline policy will be followed, which includes a system of warnings and consequences for students out of uniform.
- If a student is unavoidably out of uniform, a note from the parent is required. In this instance, students should see their Form Teacher or Student Manager for a Uniform Pass on arrival at school. Students should make every effort to return to correct uniform as soon as possible. In the meantime, they should wear a replacement item consistent with the College colours and uniform style.
- Students may be given a replacement item consistent with the College colours and uniform style
- Sandringham College reserves the right to contact parents to request immediate rectification of serious or continuous breaches of the College Uniform Policy
